# Beaver Creek Ski Patrol Bear Trap / Centennial

## Race/Golden Eagle Medical Plan

### Purpose:

Medical Plan for USSA, FIS, and High School ski racing events held on EpicMix Racing, Bear Trap, Golden Eagle and Centennial race venues.

#### Plan:

Race coverage will be provided by the Beaver Creek Ski Patrol. Race staff will coordinate with Ski Patrol Dispatch prior to each race to identify special requirements and/or procedures for each event. If dedicated venue coverage is required, ski patrol staff should be in place 15 minutes prior to the event's scheduled start time and replaced as soon as practical if they are required to leave their position for any reason.

Beaver Creek Ski Patrol Dispatch should be contacted on radio channel 2A or via telephone (x6111) to initiate a medical response. Location, access, and nature of injury should be included in any request for assistance. A member of the Ski Patrol will be immediately dispatched to provide a medical response. Additional Ski Patrol staff will be positioned to provide any required support.

The responding patroller will evaluate the athlete's injury and determine an appropriate evacuation plan. The majority of patients will be transported to the Strawberry Park Medical Center. Athletes with critical injuries may be transported to Vail Health via Eagle County Paramedic Services. A parent or coach may accompany an athlete if requested. Stop the Bleed Kit will be at the start of the race venue.

#### Equipment:

Prior to each race, one toboggan will be stationed at the top of the course for technical events. One backboard toboggan and one airway management pack will be stationed at the start for speed events (Super-g and Downhill). Any other equipment will be summoned upon request of the responding patroller and brought from ski patrol facilities on the hill. Equipment will be replaced as needed.
