Berkshire East Ski Patrol – Race Event Medical Response Plan

Medical Support Facilities on site:

The Berkshire East Ski Patrol has 2 fully stocked buildings which are the response locations:

At the summit of the hill, adjacent to the unloading area of Lift 2 (Summit Quad) – patrollers and equipment dispatched on skis or snowboard with rescue toboggans as required. (on hill incidents)

In the base area, between the main parking lot and the main lodge - patrollers and equipment dispatched on snowmobiles, or on foot as indicated, with rescue toboggans as required. (base area incidents only)

Each of these locations contain the following gear – warming area, base type radio, packed toboggan(s)(backboard, leg splint, breathing assistance devices), transport toboggan(s), leg splints, blankets, Trauma pack (Equipped for uncontrolled bleeding and/or Oxygen delivery), Automatic Electronic Defibrillator, spare medical supplies.

Additionally there is a packed toboggan staged in a “dog house” at the mid-point of the competition ski trail



During race events each of these locations is staffed by at least 1(one) patroller having a minimum medical qualification of OEC technician

All race crew have radios capable of contacting ski patrol on Channel 1.

Evacuation Protocols:

Berkshire East Ski Patrol offers quick response, stabilization and transport to all injured or ill guests. Level of care and the summoning of additional resources is determined by the first patroller on scene. Depending on the extent of visible or palpable injuries and/or the nature of illness, and the response level of the individual, a 911 call is initiated by the first on scene. If no 911 call is initiated on scene, patient is transported to the base First Aid Station indicated on the map above for further evaluation and care.

The first additional level of care is the Charlemont Ambulance service, offering basic EMT service and rapid over the road transport. The Charlemont Ambulance base is approximately one mile from Berkshire East, ambulance staffing is usually available in 10 to 15 minutes from the time Dispatch gets the call. ALS ambulance services are located in Shelburne Falls (15 Minutes out), Colrain (20 Minutes out) and Greenfield (25 Minutes out). Air Ambulance services are in Westfield MA, Worcester MA and Albany NY. ALS and Air Ambulances are dispatched as required and available by 911 Dispatch, calls are not initiated by the Berkshire East Ski Patrol.

Medical Facilities:

All routine care Basic EMT transport ambulances are routed to Baystate Franklin Medical Center Greenfield MA (413) 773-0211

Possible routing for Level 1 Trauma Center patients are: Baystate Medical Center Springfield MA (413) 794-0000, UMass Memorial Medical Center Worcester MA (508) 334-1000, or Albany Medical Center Albany NY (518) 262-3125. Location determined by which Air Ambulance Service was able to respond soonest.
